- 14 Mr. Mike Herbst, Jamaca Avenue, came forward and advised he has a failing septic that must be
- replaced. He advised he would be replacing it with a mound system as well as explained the problem
- with the septic. He outlined a letter from the County that states the location for the new septic would
- 17 require a variance from the City for the setbacks.

25 City Engineer, Diane Hankee

Jeffrey Avenue Feasibility Report – City Engineer Hankee reviewed the updated feasibility study and proposed design for the project.

- 30 Council Member Hinseth clarified the submitted petition and indicated additional signatures have
- been recently received. He also stated that he has not been contacted by the petition leader as per
- 32 Council direction last month.

33

- Council Member Fogelson clarified that this is a volunteer assessment and 75% of signatures on
- 35 Jeffrey have not yet been submitted.

36

Mr. Mike Perron, 9161 Jeffrey Blvd., came forward and stated he is against paying for the paving of the roadway indicating it's not a priority for him at this time.

It was the consensus of the City Council that the project would not move forward by means of forced assessments.

- 1 City Attorney Vivian stated a waiver would be executed for those who are being assessed voluntarily.
- 2 A public hearing would still be held on the project itself as well as the assessments.

Council Member Fogelson moved to go through the voluntary project process and schedule the public hearing. Council Member Hinseth seconded the motion.

- 7 Ms. Kim Linner, neighborhood liaison, came forward and advised she has two additional signatures
- 8 to add to the original petition. She stated the issue here is that the Council is not considering the
- 9 neighborhoods proposal. The neighborhood is proposing an area assessment meaning everyone is
- 10 assessed.

11

- 12 City Attorney Vivian distributed the revised road policy noting the third clause relating to special
- assessments and indicated an area assessment is not allowed. The City can only assess those that
- directly benefit from the project. He recommended the Council only consider volunteer assessments
- on this project at this time.

- 17 Ms. Linner stated she is in disagreement relating to the road policy. The neighborhood has moved
- forward with an alternative method for assessments and has a majority. She stated she believes they
- 19 have met the state statute and intent of the road policy.

20

- 21 Mayor Carr suggested a City initiated neighborhood meeting be scheduled to hopefully come to an
- agreement so the project can move forward.

23

- 24 Mr. Eric Linner, 9810 83rd Street, came forward and stated there are four parcels on the roadway that
- 25 the property owners do not even live there so they would not agree to the assessments.

26

- Ms. Lori Slater, 9496 85th Street, came forward and asked why there seems to be a leap from the
- preferred method of assessing to apparently going against the current ordinance.

29

- 30 Mr. Doug Schwartz, 8540 Jewel Ave., came forward and stated this has been going on for years.
- 31 Jeffery has never been brought up to standards. All roads should be in good enough shape to pave at
- 32 any time.

33

- Mr. Linner stated it is not fair if residents on Jeffrey don't pay the assessments. Area residents that
- are willing to pay are giving them a gift. He stated he was very disappointed when the City signed a
- development agreement for a subdivision without getting the assessments to pave the road at some
- point in the future.

Council Member Fogelson withdrew the motion. Council Member Hinseth withdrew the second.

Ms. Jane Knotz, 9651 83rd Street, came forward and stated a neighborhood meeting was already held and those on Jeffrey did not attend the meeting.

Mr. Dave Borth, 8193 Jody, came forward and stated he is opposed to the road improvement and 1 believes there are other ways to improve the road without paving it. 2 3 Mr. Rob Weber, 9718 83rd Street, came forward and inquired about the difference between a 4 neighborhood meeting and a public hearing. He stated the group already has the figures, construction 5 prices are at an all time low and the project should move forward now. 6 7 Mayor Carr stated he understands the fairness issue relating to volunteer assessments. Staff has 8 recommended the City does not move forward with area assessments. The neighborhood can still, 9 however, move forward with the project. The difference in cost is approximately \$800. 10 11 Ms. Linner stated there are only seven residents on the other roads in the area that have not signed the 12 petition. Jeffery residents need to pay their share of the assessments. 13 14 Mr. Tom Dornack, 9651 83rd Street, came forward and stated he agrees that the neighborhood has 15 been through all of this at previous meetings. Ms. Linner has done a great job of organizing the 16 effort. He suggested the City change the ordinance as well as have developers pay for these types of 17 improvements. He noted the Council made a mistake by not doing that. 18 19 20 Mr. Weber asked at what point the City is responsible to bring the roadway up to standards as well as who would be assessed when that happens. 21 22 It was the consensus of the Council for the Road Commissioner to schedule a City initiated 23 24 neighborhood meeting to address the project. 25 **2010 Gravel Authorization** – City Engineer Hankee stated the gravel bids are done annually and the 26 budget was reduced this year for gravel. She requested authorization to seek quotes. 27 28 29 Council Member Hinseth moved to direct the City Engineer to seek bids for the 2010 gravel project. Council Member Potter seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. 30 31 **Staff Report -** The March 2010 Engineer's Report was provided to be placed on file for review. City 32 Engineer Hankee noted a proposed site review of the elementary school expansion was done by 33 Washington County and was included in the Council packets. Road Commissioner Hinseth asked residents to understand that the weather and ground conditions must cooperate to perform almost all road maintenance functions. The weather will sometimes prevent instant road maintenance gratification.

Road Commissioner Hinseth advised grading began March 23, but the grader still encountered hard frost. Residents requested grading begin sooner but widespread patchwork grading to work around frost is not wise use of tax dollars. Asphalt repair will begin as soon as seasonal road restrictions are lifted. Potholes may be filled in other communities, but it is a short term fix. Brushing will begin when the leaves are out. A ditch reclaimer will be utilized for the first time in Grant to bring gravel that has migrated to the shoulder and ditch back onto the road. After testing the equipment to analyze capabilities, the roads to first reclaim will be the roads that are to be graveled this year.

Road Commissioner Hinseth continued with road updates noting gravel surfacing will take place as soon as possible in May based on the contractor scheduling and weather permitting.
